

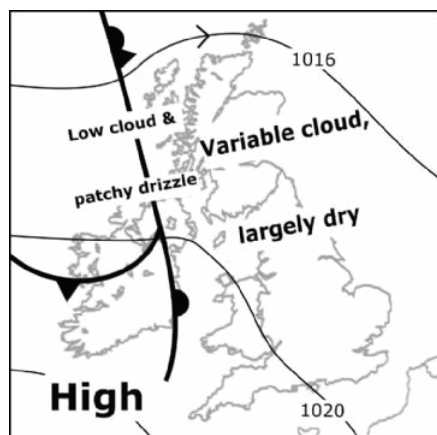
# Yorkshire Dales & North Pennines

The entire Yorkshire Dales National Park and North Pennines AONB, including the Three Peaks and Cross Fell, plus Howgills, also south to Forest of Bowland.



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## General Summary for Wednesday, 30 July, 2025



### British Mountain Summary:

#### Based on forecast chart for noon 30 July, 2025

Generally cloudy conditions, covering some hill slopes in the morning, but breaking and lifting above many tops. Occasional sun breaking through, mainly in the east. In western Scotland, a weak front pushing in will lower the cloud over coastal hills and bring a little drizzle at times. Light winds overall.

### Headline for Yorkshire Dales & North Pennines

Largely dry day, cloud lifting and breaking. Light-moderate breeze.

## Detailed Forecast for Wednesday, 30 July, 2025

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Northwest turning westerly 15 to 20mph.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Fairly small
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Substantially dry</b> Largely dry, chance of an odd drizzly shower. Into night, some rain develops from west.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Early cloud banks lifting and clearing</b> Covering higher slopes fairly widely early morning, particularly western areas, some banks to 500m or lower for a time. Lifting higher during morning, breaks forming to leave most or all cloud above hills by middle of day.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>40% rising to 90%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Patches of cloud and sun. Visibility good below/out of cloud, more widely very good with time.
<b>How Cold? (at 700m)</b>	10C rising to 13C.
<b>And in the valleys</b>	12C at dawn, rising to 20C afternoon.

## Yorkshire Dales &amp; North Pennines - Looking Ahead

	Thursday 31 July	Friday 1 August
<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	West to northwesterly 15 to 20mph.	Northwesterly 20 to 25mph, occasional 30mph higher North Pennines.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Fairly small</b>	<b>Starting to affect comfortable walking over exposed higher terrain. Feeling distinctly chilly.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Showers developing</b> Patchy rain from dawn into early morning. Some showers forming, risk local heavy bursts afternoon, later becoming focused toward the east.	<b>Showers</b> Showery rain may be frequent for periods, tending to push southwards, odd heavier bursts, may fade with time from north in afternoon.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Fairly extensive, lifting and breaking</b>  Covering the hills widely, lowest in western areas in morning. Bases rising and breaking to upper slopes, clearing most tops during afternoon; better later in day.	<b>Mostly higher tops, some breaks</b>  Banks of cloud above 700m in the morning, briefly lower in showers, but tending to rise and break higher above the hills in afternoon.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>40%</b>	<b>70%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Brief bursts of sun developing. Visibility reduced in rain, later becoming very good away from showers.	Glimpses of sun. Visibility very good away from showers.
<b>How Cold? (at 700m)</b>	11 to 14C.	8C rising to 11C. Feeling close to freezing in the wind, particularly morning.
<b>And in the valleys</b>	12C at dawn, rising to 19C afternoon.	10C at dawn, rising to 17C afternoon.

## Planning Outlook

### All mountain areas of Britain from Thursday, 31 July, 2025

Westerly winds prevail in the extended outlook, with occasional fronts moving through - western mountains often shrouded in cloud, periods of rain and drizzle. Some showery bursts of rain further eastwards, particularly Thursday-Friday this week, but often smaller amounts of rain toward easternmost hills, and cloud bases often higher with breaks to eastern summits.

Moderate breezes, sometimes more blustery - early next week looks windier for a time. Temperatures near average, though rather cool in Scotland late this week and again early next week. Ridges of higher pressure will build occasionally from the southwest for better windows of weather, particularly England & Wales.

### Forecast issued at 16:00 on Tuesday, 29 July, 2025
