

# General Summary for Thursday, 13 November, 2025



# British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 13 November, 2025

Cold northeasterlies for the Highlands, gale-force over mountains early in day. Snow mostly in northern areas. A slow-moving swathe of rain for southern Scotland and northern England, heavy at times. Previous rain eases to patchy light rain in Wales, but beware of flooding - staying mild here.

## **Headline for Yorkshire Dales & North Pennines**

Varied wind. Raining most or all day, especially north.

# Detailed Forecast for Thursday, 13 November, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	Direction and speed will vary considerably during day: Southwesterly at first in south, switching northeasterly from the north, often in range 15-30mph, possible lull for a time, risk reaching 40mph North Pennines.		
Effect of wind on you?	Highly variable: fairly small for periods, though expect local deterioration, particularly in northern areas, giving considerable wind chill.		
How wet?	Persistent rain, some heavy, flood risk		
(Precipitation and its impact)	Widespread rain from dawn, heavy during morning particularly north. Rain continues all day much of region, but tends to break up gradually and ease in intensity. Very wet underfoot, streams in spate, some flooding.		
Cloud on the hills?	Fairly extensive		
	A sheet of cloud covers high terrain in the morning; bases variable, may be locally very low at times. Most fells likely remain shrouded all day, some chance of breaks forming in west afternoon.		
Chance of cloud free summits?	20%		
Sunshine?	Overcast and dull likely all day.		
Air clarity (below cloud)	Largely poor visibility, though may improve if fog and rain break.		
How Cold? (at 700m)	5 to 7C, dropping from north later, to 3C evening. Beware feeling like -5C or below if exposed to increase of wind speed.		
And in the valleys	Around 9 or 10C from night into day, small change, then starting to fall into evening.

	Likely to often cap higher slopes of the Pennines, mostly above 700-800m. Breaks to upper slopes most often in west.	Banks of cloud mostly over higher Pennines above 700-800m, particularly eastern areas. Many hills be largely clear.
Chance of cloud free summits?	30%	60%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	A thick veil of high cloud likely to obscure the sun. Slight haze.	Sun mostly obscured by varied high cloud. Visibility good, though some haze likely.
How Cold? (at 700m)	1 or 2C. Wind chill feeling like -10 to -15C.	1 or 2C. Wind chill feeling like -15C in morning, -10C afternoon.

# **Planning Outlook**

## All mountain areas of Britain from Friday, 14 November, 2025

High rainfall with significant flooding expected for Wales by the end of this week, risk flooding too in Peak District. Drier overall across the Highlands. Strong to gale force easterlies later this week, then northerlies are expected to dominate onward into next week. Colder air extends to all areas, staying below freezing over higher mountains most likely throughout next week to 10 days. Some accumulations of snow over Scottish mountains, initially mostly northern areas, possibly more widely across all mountain areas during next week - Tuesday-Wednesday in particular, but lower confidence of forecast detail by then.
