

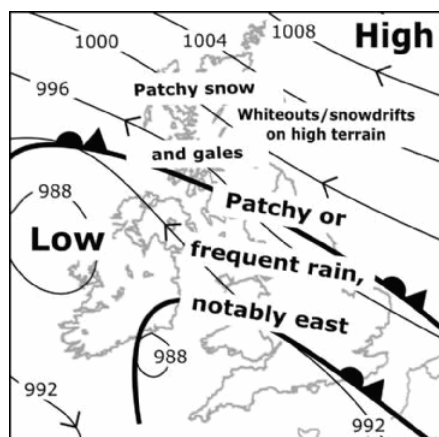

General Summary for Sunday, 25 January, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 25 January, 2026

Blustery for most, gales in Scotland which will be severe on high tops early. Continued snow and local whiteout conditions on high terrain in east Scotland, snowdrifts build here. Often raining over the Pennines and south Wales, more intermittent in north Wales and Lakeland (sleet or snow on high summits).

Headline for Yorkshire Dales & North Pennines

Blustery in exposure; fog and rain, most in the east

Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 25 January, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	East-to-southeasterly 30-45mph at dawn, strongest speeds around and north of Cross Fell. Easing with time and shifting easterly, 30-35mph into night.
Effect of wind on you?	Blustery over most high terrain, in places more frequent buffeting, particularly early where walking will be arduous on northernmost fells. Considerable wind chill.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Often raining Rain affects the high fells and eastern slopes for much of the day, falling as sleet or snow above 700m. A tendency towards lighter or more patchy rain later in the day.
Cloud on the hills?	Fairly extensive, lowest east Covering much higher terrain all day, extensively down to 400-500m in eastern areas. Higher bases westward, some breaks above 600m.
Chance of cloud free summits?	20%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Largely cloudy, becoming hazy from the east with time. Poor visibility over most hills.
How Cold? (at 700m)	Around 0 or +1C most of the day. Starting to lower slightly from the north around or after dusk. Feeling like -8 to -10C in the wind.
And in the valleys	Steady at 3 or 4C most of the day, beginning to cool afternoon.

Low cloud often covering many hills with only local sunny breaks here and there.
