

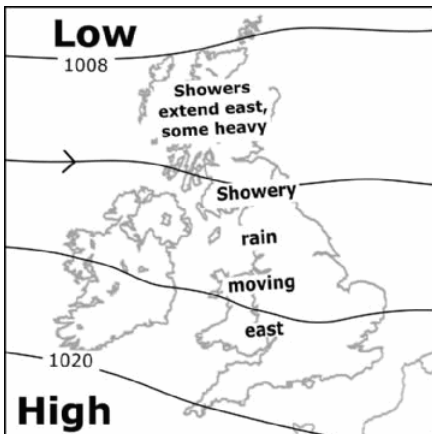
# Yorkshire Dales & North Pennines

The entire Yorkshire Dales National Park and North Pennines AONB, including the Three Peaks and Cross Fell, plus Howgills, also south to Forest of Bowland.



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## General Summary for Wednesday, 10 June, 2026



### British Mountain Summary:

**Based on forecast chart for noon 10 June, 2026**

Showery westerlies, scattered bursts of rain moving eastward across the country, locally heavy with a chance of thunder, mainly eastern areas by afternoon. Improving to drier and brighter conditions for western England and Wales with time. Breezes tending to freshen. Feeling rather cool.

### Headline for Yorkshire Dales & North Pennines

Showery, some heavy, easing from west. Breeze increasing.

## Detailed Forecast for Wednesday, 10 June, 2026

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Westerly 15 to 20mph, tending to rise during afternoon, later 25-30mph over higher fells into evening.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Fairly small in morning, more noticeably blustery with time, marked wind chill where exposed to the strongest breeze.
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	<b>Showers moving east, risk thunder</b> Showers initially western hills. These develop more widely eastward from mid morning. By afternoon, widely showery, some heavy; hail and thunder, later mainly toward east. Fading from west to leave odd light showers in evening.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Patches over tops in rain</b> Varied bases. At first, banks over western tops, elsewhere mostly clear. As showers develop widely, expect patches or banks to form at times over the tops.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>60%</b>
<b>Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)</b>	Variable cloud and patchy sun, best sun early in day eastern dales. Visibility mostly good, but poor in showers.
<b>How Cold? (at 700m)</b>	4C lifting to 6C. Feeling just below freezing in the stronger breeze, later near -5C highest tops.
<b>And in the valleys</b>	7C at dawn, lifting to highs of 13 or 14C afternoon, but dropping a few degrees in showers.

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b> <b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Southerly turning west-southwesterly later, 20 to 30mph, risk gusts reaching 40mph later in day. <b>Varied, at times fairly small, but risk feeling increasingly blustery over high terrain with noticeable wind chill.</b>	Westerly, 25 to 35mph, in places 40mph over higher Pennines. <b>Strenuous walking where exposed over high terrain, uncomfortable buffeting gusts in places. Marked wind chill.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Persistent rain</b> Rain arriving from dawn in west, some steadier heavier falls for periods through the morning. Rain breaks up in afternoon, but still drizzly rain on and off.	<b>Drizzly rain mostly west</b> Drizzly showers merging into more frequent light rain at times western areas. Patchier eastwards, more often dry some eastern dales.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Extensive low cloud</b>  Soon blanket low cloud across the fells, to lower slopes western dales, fairly extensive above 600m.	<b>Extensive, lowest west</b>  Persistent across most or all fells, often foggy to 300-500m western Yorks Dales up to Tebay. Cloud base mostly above 600m north from Kirkby Stephen and eastern dales, local breaks possible mainly Teesdale area.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>10%</b>	<b>20%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Overcast and dull, murky southwest. Poor visibility much of day in rain.	Largely cloudy, dull in west. Visibility reduced around rain in west, misty over hills; better below cloud toward east.
<b>How Cold? (at 700m)</b>  <b>And in the valleys</b>	5C rising to 9C. Feeling like 0 to -3C directly in wind.  9C at dawn rising to 13C afternoon, or slightly milder toward evening.	8C rising to 11C afternoon. Feeling near 0C where exposed to wind.  11C at dawn, rising to 17C afternoon.

## Planning Outlook

### All mountain areas of Britain from Thursday, 11 June, 2026

Damp westerly breezes on Friday will cloak most mountains in cloud and some drizzle, better conditions eastwards. Cool and strong westerlies persist in Scotland on Saturday, then warmer with lighter winds by Sunday. Some patchy rain remaining in west and northwest Scotland over the weekend. Pressure tends to rise from the south this weekend, bringing warmer air and drier conditions to England & Wales, although west coast mountains may hold onto cloud. Into next week, a mixed southwesterly pattern remains, windy at times with periods of rain, drizzle and low cloud most persistent in the west. Warmest in England and Wales, but cooler westerly air likely returns at times mid-late week. Higher pressure then shows more signs of expanding over the country by late next week bringing improving conditions.

### Forecast issued at 16:01 on Tuesday, 9 June, 2026
