

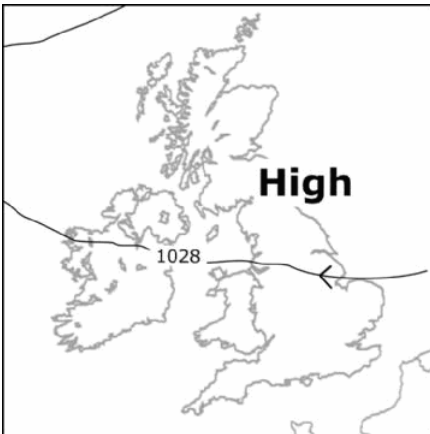

## General Summary for Sunday, 21 June, 2026



**British Mountain Summary:  
Based on forecast chart for noon 21 June, 2026**

Extensive bright sunshine - beware of sunburn and dehydration - and light wind. Cloud and a few brief showers NW Highlands will move away north, whilst along the Pennines and later Cumbria and S Scotland, patchy cloud and an isolated shower will form.

**Headline for Yorkshire Dales & North Pennines**

Light wind; bright sunshine, mainly morning. VRisk rain briefly.

## Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 21 June, 2026

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Easterly or variable, 10mph or less, but through afternoon strengthening to 20 or 25mph.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Negligible much of day.</b>
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	<b>Rain very unlikely</b> Risk isolated bursts of rain afternoon.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Hills clear most or all day</b> There may well be none, but risk fog now and again higher slopes afternoon (most likely during/after a shower).
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>Above 90%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Bright sunshine morning, intermittently cloudy afternoon. Visibility excellent or superb.
<b>How Cold? (at 700m)</b>	11C at dawn, rising to 17C.
<b>And in the valleys</b>	12C at dawn, rising to 23C afternoon, increasingly humid.

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	South to southeasterly between 15 and on higher tops perhaps 25mph.	Southwesterly 15 to perhaps 25mph,.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Fairly small</b>	<b>Fairly small.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Risk bursts of rain, possible thunder</b> Confidence low: probably dry. But small risk of a few bursts of rain, perhaps brief although possibly isolated thunder.	<b>Rain unlikely</b> Chance thundery showers at first.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Very little for most of the day - may form in rain.</b> Generally the hills free of cloud although fog may form on higher slopes in rain.	<b>Little if any</b> Fog here and there after dawn - clearing within a few hours
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>90%</b>	<b>Soon almost certain</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Patches of sunshine although extensive high level cloud. Visibility good, although a haze.	Sunshine extensive, sometimes weak due to thin high level cloud. Good visibility although hazy.
<b>How Cold? (at 700m)</b>	17C - very warm.	17C rising to a very warm (and exceptionally humid) 22C.
<b>And in the valleys</b>	22 to 25C in afternoon - feeling humid.	Very warm indeed as afternoon temperatures approach 28 to perhaps locally 30C.

**Planning Outlook****All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 22 June, 2026**

Extensively dry, very warm but very humid indeed England and Wales, although around Monday chance of a thunderstorm. Rain and low cloud at times Scotland, mainly affecting western mountains - although later next week the warmth encroaching into Scotland. There may well be widespread thunderstorms later in the week, before less hot weather extends from the Atlantic around next weekend.
