

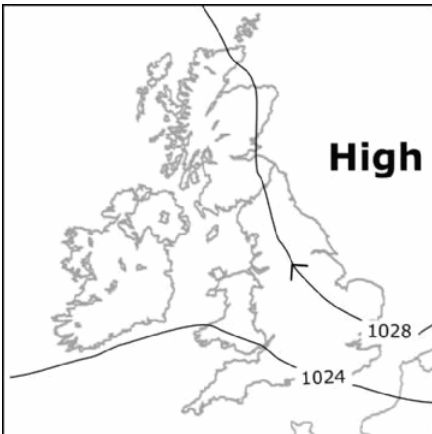

General Summary for Monday, 22 June, 2026



**British Mountain Summary:
Based on forecast chart for noon 22 June, 2026**

Although high pressure will dominate - bringing high temperatures and sunshine to Wales and most of England, in the far north and across Scotland, high level cloud may bring rain for an hour or two, this leading to formation of low cloud that may be very slow to lift.

Headline for Yorkshire Dales & North Pennines

Light wind. Sunshine increasingly and very warm; but chance of shower.

Detailed Forecast for Monday, 22 June, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	South to southeasterly between 10mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Negligible
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Risk of the odd shower but extensively dry Here and there a burst of rain.
Cloud on the hills?	Very little for most of the day - may form in rain. Patches particularly more eastern fells for a few hours from dawn; but will all clear.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Greater than 90% by late morning
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Increasingly sunny although areas of high level cloud, most widely morning. Visibility good, although a haze.
How Cold? (at 700m)	14 rising to 18C - very warm.
And in the valleys	22 to 25C in afternoon - feeling humid.

How windy? (On the summits)	Southwesterly 15mph or less.	Direction may well vary, 10mph or less.
Effect of wind on you?	Negligible	Negligible
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain unlikely Chance thundery showers at first.	Rain not expected
Cloud on the hills?	Little if any Fog here and there after dawn - clearing within a few hours	Little if any
Chance of cloud free summits?	Soon almost certain	90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sunshine extensive, perhaps sometimes weak due to thin high level cloud. Good visibility although hazy.	Extensive sunshine. Hazy.
How Cold? (at 700m)	17C rising to a very warm (and exceptionally humid) 22C.	18C rising toward an exceptionally warm 21 to perhaps 24C.
And in the valleys	Very warm indeed as afternoon temperatures approach 28 to perhaps locally 30C.	Rising to 28 to perhaps 31C in the afternoon.

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Tuesday, 23 June, 2026**

A few days of often sunny and very warm weather. Some doubt remains about daytime temperatures - these possibly exceptionally hot on Wednesday (England and Wales) and Thursday (everywhere). The range in mountain temperatures given on Wednesday's forecasts reflects the uncertainty. Gradually less hot Friday and into the weekend; the change accompanied by thunderstorms in some areas.
