

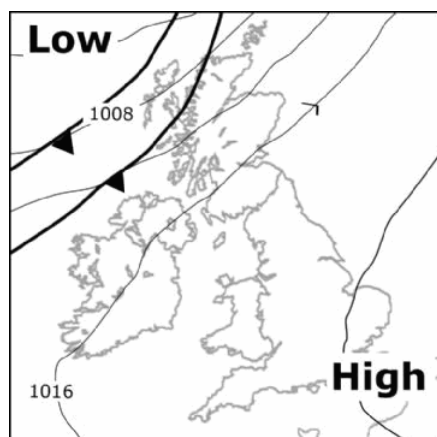

General Summary for Saturday, 8 August, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 8 August, 2026

Ranging from persistent gales, and increasingly toward west and north, rain and fog across the Scottish Highlands to blustery but largely dry Cumbria and S Scotland. Extensively warm and sunny elsewhere.

Headline for Yorkshire Dales & North Pennines

Blustery, mainly N Pennines. Dry; periods of sun - beware sunburn.

Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 8 August, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	Southerly 25 to on higher tops N Pennines 30mph most of the day, although 5 to 10mph lighter post dawn and again in evening. In Yorkshire, below about 500m, 20mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly fairly small, but on higher summits, particularly N Pennines, expect significant buffeting through the day.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain not expected
Cloud on the hills?	Little if any Patches may form above 500m westernmost slopes between Ingleton and Tebay. Otherwise hills cloud free.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Almost certain
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Periods of sunshine, later giving way (mainly N Pennines) as high level cloud thickens. Excellent visibility.
How Cold? (at 700m)	11C rising to 14 to 16C, mildest eastern Yorks Dales NP.
And in the valleys	11C at dawn rising to 18 to 20C.

Yorkshire Dales & North Pennines - Looking Ahead

	Sunday 9 August	Monday 10 August
How windy? (On the summits) Effect of wind on you?	Westerly 30 to at times 40mph on higher tops and some higher passes and cols. May ease markedly north Pennines later. Strenuous-to-arduous conditions; buffeting gusts and notable wind chill. Later conditions may ease markedly most likely only N Pennines.	Northwesterly 15-20mph, dropping to very low speeds by afternoon. Becoming negligible
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain and drizzle on and off Rain and drizzle from time to time. May tend to improve slowly and may later clear completely N Pennines.	Rain very unlikely
Cloud on the hills? Chance of cloud free summits?	Very extensive Widespread fog across the hills, from 200 or 300m up western Yorkshire dales. Highest cloud base N Pennines and eastern dales elsewhere where most cloud above 500 or 600m. Could later in day clear at least into N Pennines 30%	Clearing during morning By mid morning, cloud rare below 900m; then very likely clearing. 80%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Overcast and often dull with poor visibility. May improve from north late in day.	Periods of sun - perhaps through areas of high level cloud. Excellent or increasingly superb visibility.
How Cold? (at 700m) And in the valleys	11 to 13C, warmest Yorks Dales, later trending towards the cooler end of the range. 13C at dawn, rising to 18 or 19C.	8C, rising to 14C. Will reach 18 to 20C by mid or late afternoon.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 9 August, 2026

Extensively fine and warm early next week - indeed very little rain or low cloud and frequently light winds England and Wales all week.

Generally less settled after midweek northwestwards across Scotland where occasional rain and areas of low cloud.
