

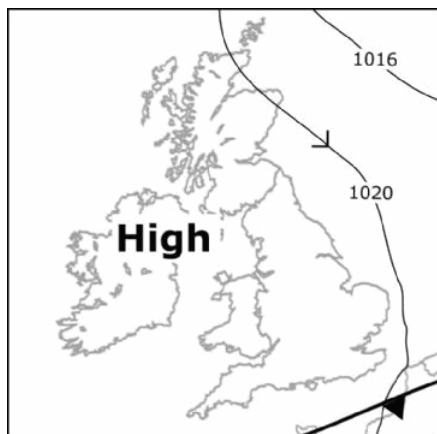

General Summary for Monday, 10 August, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 10 August, 2026

Windy in northern and western Scotland, particularly morning. Elsewhere, the breeze dropping away. Periods of bright sunshine, particularly England and Wales - beware sunburn.

Headline for Yorkshire Dales & North Pennines

Wind dropping. Periods bright sun.

Detailed Forecast for Monday, 10 August, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	Northwesterly 15-20mph, dropping to very low speeds by afternoon.
Effect of wind on you?	Becoming negligible
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain not expected
Cloud on the hills?	Cloud soon confined above the summits By mid morning, cloud rare below 900m; then all clearing.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Almost certain
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Periods of sun - perhaps through areas of high level cloud. Excellent or increasingly superb visibility.
How Cold? (at 700m)	8C, rising to 14C.
And in the valleys	Will reach 18 to 20C by mid or late afternoon.

	Tuesday 11 August	Wednesday 12 August
How windy? (On the summits)	Southerly 10 or 15mph.	Southerly increasing from around 10mph lower slopes to 20mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly negligible	Small
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain not expected	Small risk of a burst of showery rain Possibly the odd shower, perhaps briefly heavy, but substantially dry.
Cloud on the hills?	Very unlikely	Little if any
Chance of cloud free summits?	90%	90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	More or less unbroken sunshine. Excellent or superb visibility.	Extensive sunshine. Very good visibility although a haze.
How Cold? (at 700m)	10C rising to 20C	14 rising to 20C.
And in the valleys	Rising to 25 to perhaps locally 27C by mid or late afternoon.	Reaching 24 to 27C in the afternoon.

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Tuesday, 11 August, 2026**

Chance of bursts of rain, possibly locally thundery on Wednesday NW England northwards, with further occasional rain (and low cloud) later in the week, mainly across the W & NW Highlands.
The almost completely dry and warm weather will persist elsewhere. Underfoot conditions will remain exceptionally dry.
There may well be little change in the pattern into next week.
