

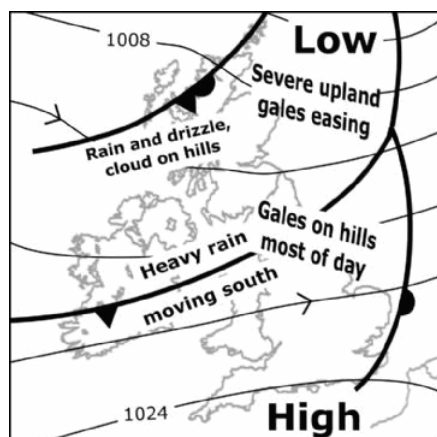
# Yorkshire Dales & North Pennines

## General Summary for Saturday, 12 September, 2026



### British Mountain Summary:

#### Based on forecast chart for noon 12 September, 2026

Severe gales from dawn on Scottish mountains ease during morning, moderate speeds by mid-afternoon, whilst gales continue on tops in England & Wales until later. An intense band of rain moves south, followed by still frequent rain, some showery bursts plus low cloud western hills. Drier later north Scotland.

### Headline for Yorkshire Dales & North Pennines

Gales until later in day. Heavy rain in morning, lighter afternoon.

(On the summits)</b>                | Southwesterly, rising through dawn to 45-60mph, stronger gusts; speeds only begin to drop from north below 40mph later afternoon, shifting westerly 25-30mph into evening.                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                  |
| <b>Effect of wind on you?</b>                     | <b>Very difficult walking conditions with powerful gusts to low levels until later in daytime, on exposed high terrain you may be blown over. Considerable wind chill.</b>                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                  |
| <b>How wet?</b><br>(Precipitation and its impact) | <b>Heavy rain in morning particularly western Dales, fading, but staying damp</b><br>Rain sweeps around dawn, becoming persistently heavy in morning for western Dales up to Tebay, relatively smaller amounts northeast areas, but still raining for several hours. Then fading from the north during afternoon, leaving patchy lighter rain and drizzle, odd brief showery bursts possible; some drier windows northeast. |
| <b>Cloud on the hills?</b>                        | <b>Extensive, lowest in rain</b><br>Blanket cloud across the fells during rain, to lower slopes western areas south from Tebay. Higher bases north and east above 600m with some breaks locally, lifting later in day, but western tops often capped.                                                                                                                                                                       |
| <b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>              | <b>20%</b>                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                  |
| <b>Sunshine?</b><br>Air clarity (below cloud)     | Cloudy and dull, some brighter skies mainly north later.<br>Widely poor visibility in rain, locally better east, but some haze; improving north.                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                            |
| <b>How Cold? (at 700m)</b>                        | 10C rising to 12C, quite humid.<br>Feeling like -2 to -5C directly in wind.                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                 |
